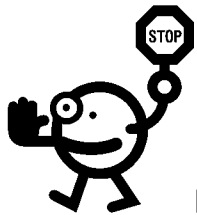

CROSSING GUARDS ARE IMPORTANT

Many of us remember growing up with either a crossing guard or a safety patrol person making sure that everyone was safe as we went to and from school.

The City of Easton in conjunction with the Easton Area School District is looking for community members who are interested in being crossing guards for the FA March School on College Hill.

Guards will be trained by the Easton Police Department in a 3 hour session and then put in place for a 2 week trial period from June 1st through June 14th.



Each guard will be paid a salary of \$21.75/day. Guards must be available on school days, from 8:30am to 9:00am & 3:15pm to 3:45pm.



WHY CROSSING GUARDS?

Some might ask why we need crossing guards at the FA March School. Here's what some of our civic leaders had to say about this initiative:

"The March School is a unique situation, situated in the heart of a neighborhood (College Hill) with plenty of activity when the children are arriving. We think that using Crossing Guards here will calm some of the excitement in the mornings as children and parents are arriving as school as well as when the kids get out in the afternoons."
